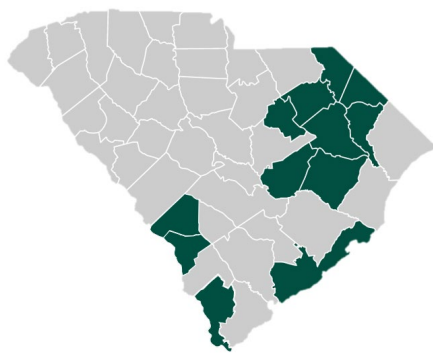
The Scholarship

High school students who meet our straightforward criteria are eligible to receive up to \$40,000 to earn a degree from some of our state's best colleges and universities.

How Our Scholarship Works

The Meeting Street Scholarship provides up to \$5,000 per semester for up to four years.

As a “last-dollar” scholarship, we build upon federal, state, institutional and other scholarships and grants to close the funding gap on direct billable costs.

Eligible Institutions

To qualify for the Scholarship, you must enroll at an eligible in-state institution with a six-year graduation rate higher than 50 percent. Students who attend these colleges and universities are more likely to graduate in six years. This report features in-depth profiles on each of these 17 exceptional schools.

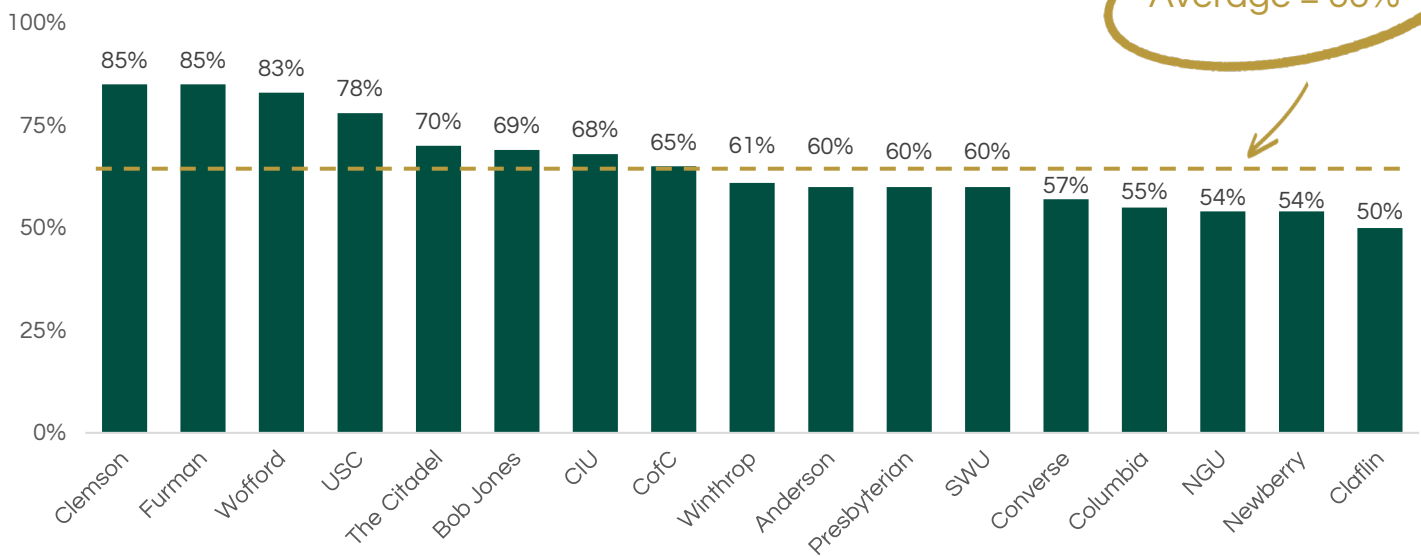


Graduation Rates

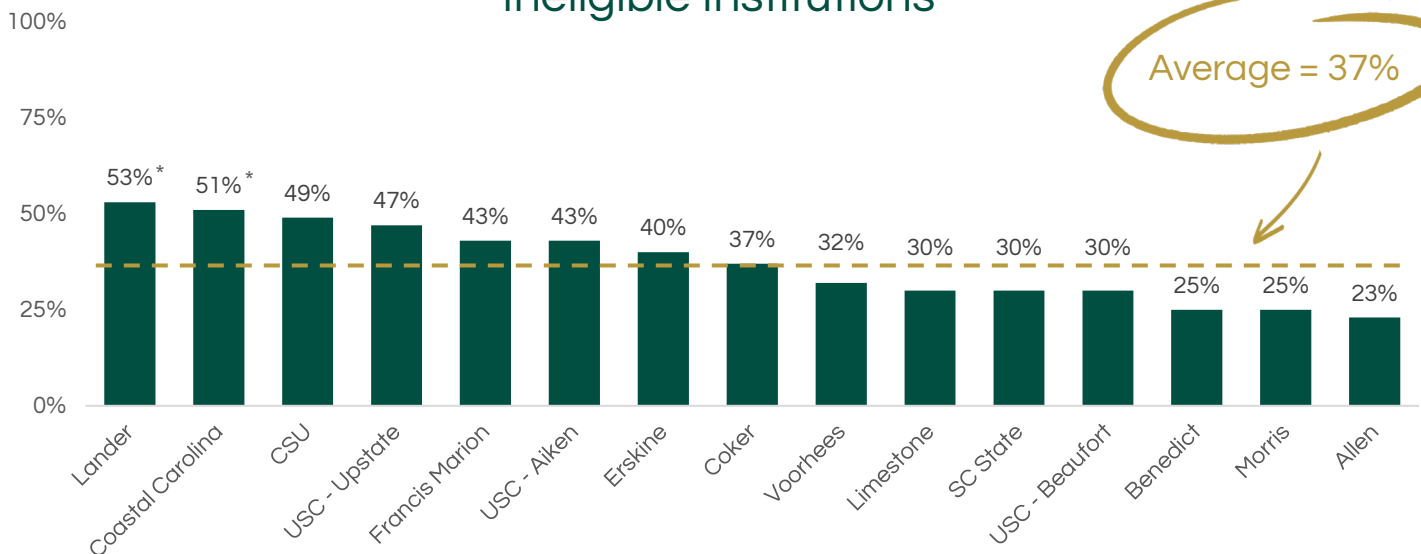
Graduation rates represent the percentage of students who complete their degree program within six-years. This key metric is an indicator of the quality of a school's academic programs and student support structures. Generally, a higher graduation rate shows that a school is committed to helping students attain their educational goals.

Our list of eligible institutions have an average six-year graduation rate of 65% while the ineligible institutions have an average graduation rate of 37%.

Ineligible Institutions

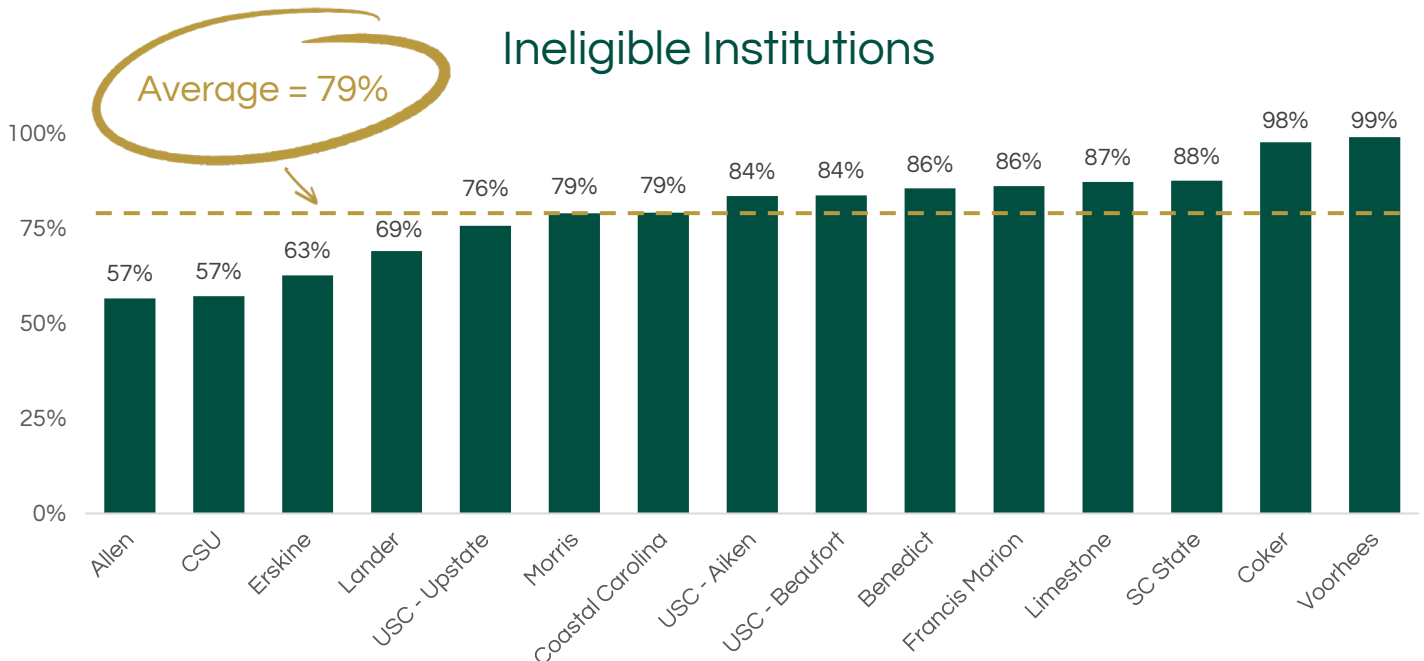
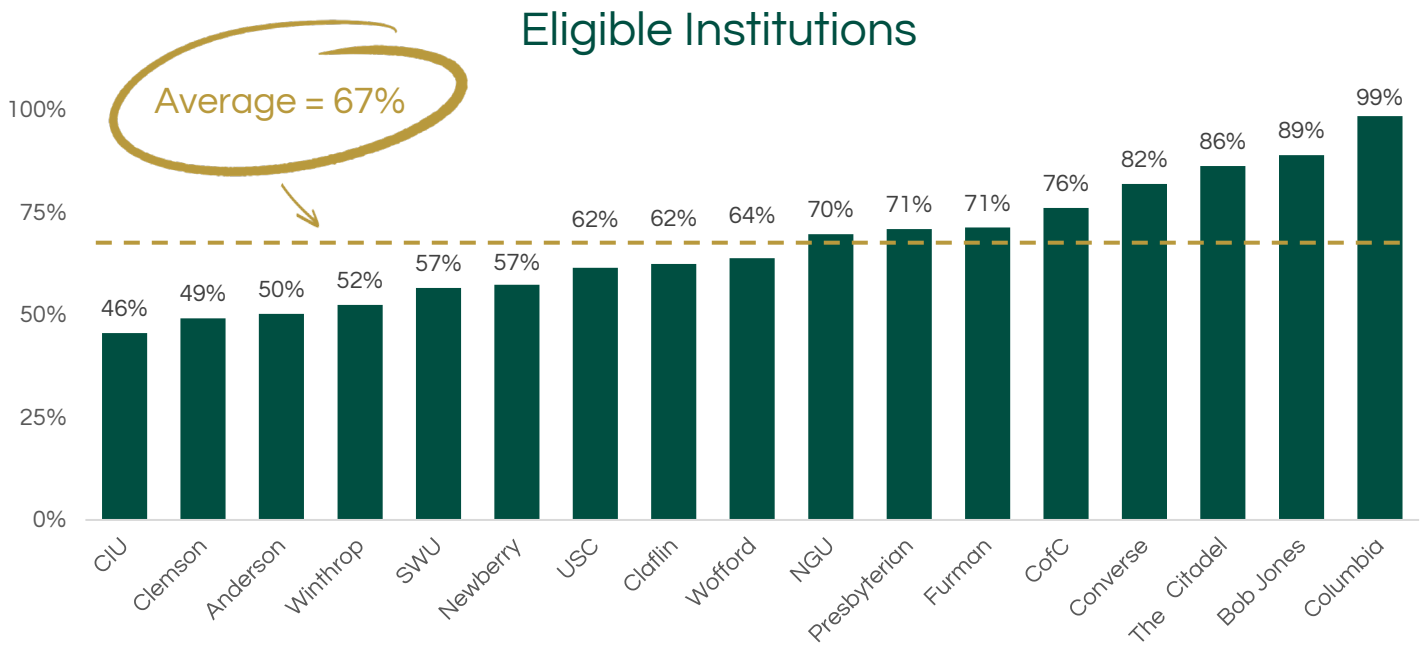

College Selectivity

Acceptance rates are another valuable data point to consider during the application process. These rates are an indicator of the competitiveness of a school's admission process. A lower rate suggests that a school is more selective and might uphold higher academic expectations.

On average, our eligible institutions have an acceptance rate of 67%, while the ineligible institutions' average acceptance rate is 79%.





Featured Institutions

Among the 17 fantastic colleges eligible for the Meeting Street Scholarship, we are highlighting the five institutions where most recipients enroll: University of South Carolina – Columbia, Clemson University, College of Charleston, Claflin University and Winthrop University. Claflin University



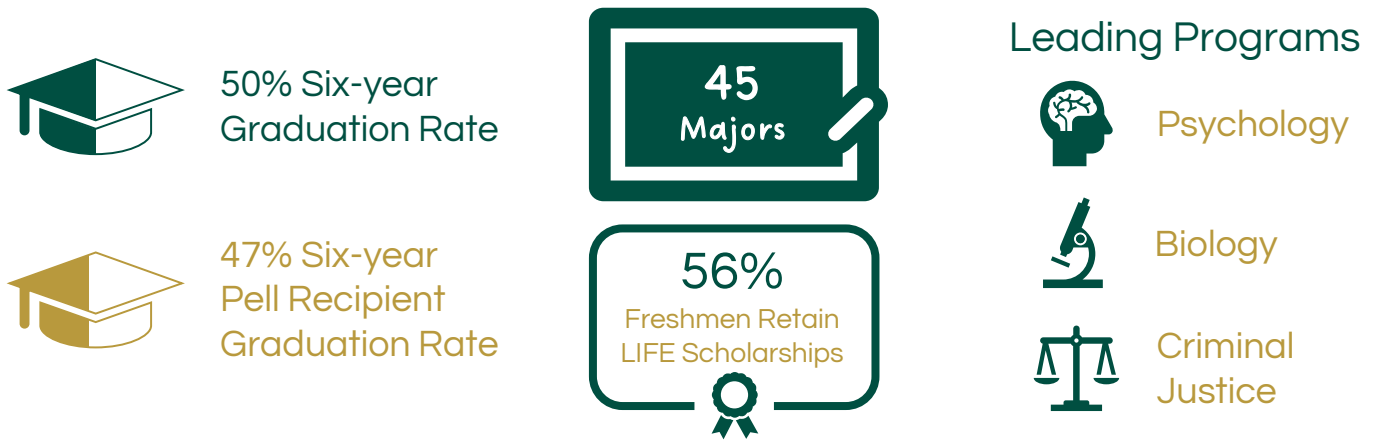
