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MEETING STREET SCHOLARSHIP FUND FSA ID CREATION GUIDE





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The FSA ID is a username and password you will use to complete the FAFSA as well as access other parts of studentaid.gov

It usually takes 1-3 days for an FSA ID to be confirmed by the Social Security Administration (SSA).

Once your FSA ID is confirmed, it will be fully functional and allow you to create and complete your FAFSA. We recommend that students and parents create FSA IDs at least three days before completing the FAFSA form.



Anyone required to provide information on a FAFSA form must create an FSA ID.

All eligible students need FSA IDs to complete the FAFSA and qualify for federal student aid, including the Federal Pell Grant and federal student loans.

For *most* students, *at least one parent* must also create an FSA to provide information as part of the student's FAFSA form.



Should undocumented <u>students</u> create FSA IDs?

We do not recommend undocumented students create FSA IDs because they are not eligible for federal financial aid. They should contact the college(s) to which they are accepted for more information.

Can undocumented <u>parents</u> create an FSA ID?

Yes! Parents without a Social Security number (SSN) will need to answer identity verification questions to confirm their identity. The questions are based on personal information entered earlier in the process and information from the TransUnion Credit Bureau. Parents can add their Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) to the FAFSA form if they have one.



For most students, at least one parent will also need an FSA ID.

FAFSA considers the student's "parent" to be <u>only</u> their legal (biological or adoptive) parent. Legal guardians and custodians are not considered "parents" by FAFSA. The person who claims a student on tax forms is also not considered when determining a parent.

Use the chart on the next slide and the <u>FAFSA Parent Wizard</u> to help you identify which parent needs to create an FSA ID.

You will need access to both your email account and cell phone to create your FSA ID.

Each Social Security number, email address and phone number can only be linked to one FSA ID.

What You Can Do With Your Account

You must have an account to do the following:

- Fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA $\ensuremath{^{\circ}}$) form online
- Complete other online forms (such as the *Master Promissory Note*) required to receive aid
- Review the federal student aid you've received

What You'll Need

- Your Social Security number (if applicable)
- Your own email address

Step 3 – Enter Personal Information



- Enter your name exactly as it appears on your Social Security card, U.S. passport or driver's license.
- 2. Enter your date of birth.
- Enter your Social Security number (SSN) exactly as it appears on your Social Security card or click "What if I don't have a Social Security number?" option for next steps.

 - DO NOT USE the email address associated with your school district!

3. Create a password

- Must be over 6 characters and contain at least one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter, and one number
- <u>Cannot</u> include your name, date of birth, or Social Security number
- 4. Write down your username and password in a secure location!
- 5. Consider using the Notes app or similar app to keep one list of your college-related usernames and passwords

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Step 5 – Enter Contact Information



- 1. Enter your permanent address (usually, where you live)
- 2. Provide mobile phone number (highly recommended)
 - This can help get into your account if you forget your password
 - It also gives you the option to use it with two-step verification

Step 9 – Two-Step Verification



- Set up two-step verification for your FSA ID
 - SMS (highly recommended)
 - Email (highly recommended)
 - Authenticator App
- Start process by clicking "Verify" next to the option
- We recommend setting up <u>at least two</u> methods, so you have multiple options when logging in

- You will get a text message with a six-digit code
- Enter code when prompted and select "continue"

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Step 11 – Email Verification

- You should receive an email with the subject line "Action Required - Verify Your FSA ID Email Address"
- Can't find it? Check your spam and junk folders.
- Enter 6-digit number from email, when prompted







Each type of verification you set up correctly will have a green check mark and say "verified"



We recommend setting up both SMS & email verification!

Step 13 – Secure Backup Code



- The secure backup code will help you access your account if the other verification methods won't work
- Make note of your backup code and store it somewhere safe
- Check the box once you have and click "Continue"
